"Holidays have always been difficult for me, having a small child. I so badly wanted to start magical traditions to end the long line of stress and childhood trauma that has always wrapped the string of holidays in a tight bow. While involved with my abuser, I was pulled away and out of all of my relationships.

When we left, his family turned their backs on us and defended him. His abuse and behavior was a known issue, but they felt I should be more 'understanding' and 'patient' with him.

Between an unexpected move, living paycheck to paycheck, and scraping by, the dream and joy of indulging in the most basic of holiday traditions seemed to fall further and further away.

At first, I was hesitant to put my name in [to have my family adopted in the [Adopt-A-Family](#) program]; Mr. Anderson explained that it is a blessing for other people to want to help and it should be accepted with open arms. Out of pride, I neglected to submit my paperwork by the deadline. Mr. Anderson informed me that he, in fact, submitted an application for us prior to the deadline on behalf of my daughter and I.


The family who 'adopted' my daughter and I went above and beyond expectations. We were given warm blankets, gift cards to shop for groceries, and I was able to get my daughter a few gifts with the gift cards from 'Santa'.

Hearing her laugh and be so shocked that Santa ACTUALLY CAME to her house still floods me with emotion. My daughter deserves bundles of magic in her life, I hope this family (and this foundation) know that not only did you make Christmas a memorable moment for my daughter and I, but you also started a healing process that I did not know I was in need of.

A 'thank you' cannot and will not be enough, but know that when I tuck her into bed, and we have read her new favorite book, or when she is playing with her doll, or when I am wrapping her up warm with a blanket she loves that was gifted to us by Angels, I am thinking and thanking you all every step of the way."

Camp HOPE goes Ice Skating

This month, Camp HOPE kicked off its very first pathways event for 2022 with our Camp HOPE youth! This ice skating event, offered to youth ages 12 to 17 years old, helped support the concept of “challenge by choice,” which challenges the children participants without pushing them too far outside of their comfort zones. As most people are avoidant of ice and struggle with learning to skate out on the ice, this experience taught perseverance and confidence-building. We had 13 young people join us for a full day of skating, pizza, and meaningful conversation. In other words, we had a blast! Thanks to our amazing team of staff and volunteers that made this event possible.

“I really appreciated the support of camp hope with helping me overcome my fear of the ice. I have never gone before and they encouraged me and pushed me to keep going”.


