Crisis House Celebrates Earth Day

This April, we celebrate Earth Day (April 22nd) and are inspired by this year's theme, "Invest in our Planet." A green future is a prosperous future that our children will inherit and depend on throughout their lives.

For this reason, Crisis House is committed to acting (boldly), innovating (broadly), and implementing (equitably). Through our Camp HOPE programming, we create and facilitate opportunities for families and their children to engage in outdoor experiences within San Diego by covering all costs related to fees, permits, and other expenses. Each year, Camp HOPE programming hosts 15+ cost-free activities in outdoor spaces within San Diego County.

Children under the age of twelve living in San Diego County are particularly vulnerable due to the limited resources for survivors within low-income and racially diverse communities. It is our goal to confront the equity barriers that hinder a child's ability to access healing through green space, including addressing safety issues, lack of transportation, and the burden of high fees,


permits, and expenses.

A Veteran's Story



"We aren't too strong to ask for help..."

Crisis House takes pride in working hard to help individuals experiencing hard times. We pursue every avenue to help our clients improve their lives. Over the last month, the Homeless Outreach Team befriended "James" (pseudonym for privacy purposes) experiencing homelessness in Lemon Grove and began working to find him a housing solution.

James is an Army Veteran who has been homeless for more than three years due to the breakdown of relationships within his family. We found him living under a tarp on the side of the highway with his new puppy. We began cultivating a relationship with him and providing him with food, water, and clothing.

Crisis House helped James search for and secure a stable and pet-friendly place to live. He is grateful to our Outreach Team for helping him find a safe place to call home. It has taken a heavy load off his shoulders, allowing him to

focus on other important issues, such as addressing health problems and searching for a job.

"As vets, we aren't too strong to ask for help," James said. "The help is there for us, let's use every resource we have to make our situation better."

James is now working with his new case manager as he looks for a job and permanent housing.

This event focused on creating meaningful relationships with one another, while also building momentum for this year's long-awaited summer camp! Every month, Camp HOPE programming provides kids with various trauma-informed activities and ongoing mentorship leading up to our annual week-long summer camp experience!

Camp HOPE also had the opportunity to learn all about marine life, thanks to the **Birch Research Aquarium!** As we toured the aquarium and learned about marine creatures that intrigued the kids, we used our creative skills to draw them and present our artwork to the group! Developing public speaking skills is critical in children who have been abused or have experienced domestic violence abuse, as they tend to shy away from the spotlight rather than thrive in it!

Crisis House prioritizes the needs of our community's children through Camp HOPE. This program provides trauma-informed camperships, year-round mentorship, counseling, and other activities to 125 children each year. This cost-free programming provided to underserved children in San Diego has a reputation of accomplishment in healing children struggling with the effects of trauma as a result of domestic violence.
