## Resilience & Combined Efforts Help a Family off the Streets



#### Homeless Outreach Team Helps Couple Off the Streets!

For more than five years, the streets of El Cajon were this couple's home. A work-related shoulder injury left the husband unable to work, which led to them being displaced from the apartment they had called home for nine years. Not having the means or resources to fight eviction, our client and his wife took what they could and moved into their van that they would call home for five years. These factors, compounded by the unexpected death of their son, made it a very challenging time for these two.

They had been staying in a cul-de-sac when they were approached by the H.A.R.T. (Homeless Assistance Resource Team) in April 2021. The Crisis

House Outreach Team immediately stepped in to connect them with food, hygiene, and many other resources while they established a relationship of trust. After several months of case management services and motel vouchers from the San Diego CARES Act, Crisis House connected them to the HUD-VASH program a joint HUD-VA initiative to move Veterans and their families out of homelessness and into permanent housing. With the help of the Homeless Outreach Team at Crisis House, they found an apartment that would accept them HUD-VASH voucher, and this resilient couple moved in on June 15th, 2022. We connected them with Bridge of Hope and were given furniture, dishes, linens, and fresh food for their new apartment.

Building trusting relationships greatly influence whether individuals can fully access and utilize the services available. Some of the biggest obstacles when developing or finding housing for individuals who've experienced homelessness are bad credit, no rental history, not enough income and the stigma placed on affordable housing, and the adverse community reaction to these new neighbors. Working together, we can make a difference that can change the future of individuals, families, and communities.

Our staff has been working hard creating a memorable summer camp experience at Camp Marston in Julian, CA, for two weeks in August! Campers participate in various activities ranging from field games to rock climbing, canoeing to archery, gaga ball to gold panning, and art projects to campfire songs. Campers are 'Challenged by Choice' to step outside of their comfort zone and accomplish an activity they haven't had the opportunity to do before to overcome their fears and build confidence that leads to increased self-esteem. Campers learn about real people, not much older than they are, who have overcome adversity, abuse, and other real-life challenges to show them that they are not alone and that their past does not define their future.


We can't wait to share the stories from camp with you next month!

## Crisis House expands to One Safe Place in North County!



The District Attorney, County leaders, health professionals, and law enforcement celebrated the opening of One Safe Place in San Marcos. One

Safe Place, operated by the Family Justice Center, is a one-stop service destination created to support domestic violence, child abuse, elder abuse, human trafficking, and violent loss victims. The new center opened its doors to the public on July 5th, 2022. Child and adult victims of abuse and their families can go to One Safe Place and receive acute crisis care, forensic medical exams, advocacy, counseling and therapy, legal services such as restraining orders, connections to a safe shelter and housing, long-term mentoring, workforce readiness, clothing, and educational opportunities all under one roof.

Co-located professionals at One Safe Place include victim advocates, nurses, medical professionals, counselors, attorneys, housing navigators, childcare professionals, work-readiness coaches, law enforcement, and more. One Safe Place is a multi-agency service center that focuses on reducing the number of times victims tell their stories, the number of places victims must go for help, and increasing access to services and support for victims and their children.

Crisis House will have a dedicated staff member available at the Center to assist families and children impacted by domestic violence, alongside more than 70 community agencies partnered with One Safe Place. One Safe Place is open to walk-ins Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
